





## Welcome to FAVELAS, the heartbeat of Brazil's hillsides!

Originally started as a refuge for migrants seeking informal economy opportunities, faces challenges like extreme segregation and lack of essential services, yet its streets remain self-organized and adaptable. Despite socio-economic hardships, Rocinha thrives with cultural expressions, lively social gatherings, and commercial activities. Imagine football matches through the streets, vibrant street art and the rhythm of dance and music shaping the essence of communal life in this dynamic favela-creativity and community spirit. Welcome to Rocinha, where every corner tells a story, and every step resonates with the heartbeat of a unique urban landscape.

Rocinha, like the thousands of other slum areas throughout the world, reveals miserable, inhumane conditions, including poverty, crime, lack of public spaces and filth.

In response to this matter, the UN suggests a transformative solution by creating open public spaces. These spaces, when thoughtfully designed, have the potential to mitigate crime and violence, provide room for economic activities, and offer vital services to a diverse range of users. Particularly crucial for marginalized communities, these public spaces act like "**the poor man's living room**" serving as vital hubs for recreation, social interactions, and the development of communities.

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**Public spaces**-refer to undeveloped land as accessible, unbuilt land that offers recreational spaces and i mproves neighborhood environmental quality. (UN Habitat)

In essence, the call is to transform these unused spaces into vibrant, accessible landscapes that enhance the collective well-being and quality of life for urban communities.



- Design a conceptual public space in the heart of favelas.
- The design should facilitate various activities, from art exhibitions, festivals, and sports. The architectural concept intends to be flexible and multipurpose area.
- The particpants are free to keep/reuse/ connect/transform the surroundings.
